WMA student plays organ, piano

► Teen enjoys pop, rock, country & classical - & she plays sacred music at Mass

Natalie Brant is an uncommon 13-year-old girl: She plays piano and organ. In fact, she plays the organ for Mass every Friday at her Catholic school.

"I can do almost whatever I want on the piano, but with the organ I do mostly church songs," Brant said. "I love both."

Her family has a piano at home, and Brant's interest in music was sparked when she was a child.

"My grandparents had an organ and we'd always mess around with it," she said.

Brant began taking piano lessons in fourth grade.

"My best friend started learning," she recalled. "She didn't go very far, but that's

Brant also started taking organ lessons when she was a fifth-grader from her church's organist. She said many think the instruments are basically the same, but she described the piano and organ as "very different."

After her piano instructor stopped teaching, Brant even-

tually enrolled in lessons at the Wichita Music Academy. She recently celebrated her one-year anniversary as a student at the academy, where she enjoys studying with Su Kheng Kang.

"I like her a lot," Brant said.
"I've learned a lot. None of

until I had her."

Brant listens to a variety of music – pop, rock, country and classical.

"I'll learn any of them," she added. "I like the pop ones the most. Everybody knows them."

Kang said Brant was a good student.

"She is an outgoing student," Kang continued. "She has her own goal and she works hard toward the goal. She is

'Music's everything in my life'

► Wichita Music Academy instructor began teaching guitar in high school

Les Clark loves teaching students to play guitar and ukulele. He wants them to enjoy the benefits that he discovered making music.

"Music's helped me out a billion times. You get sad, you write a song, you know?" he said. "Also, to see somebody grow is kind of cool. The most selfish thing about teaching is it makes me a better player because I have to do it right."

He likes a variety of music, and he's willing to learn songs that students bring to Garten's Music, home of the Wichita Music Academy.

"If I don't know it, I'll learn it," Clark said. "I have no problem doing that."

Clark decided when he was a child that he wanted to be a singer like Meat Loaf. Then he saw "La Bamba," the movie about Ritchie Valens, and that sparked a desire to learn guitar.

Clark received a Yamaha junior guitar when he was 7, but he didn't play it much. When he saw the movie, he began pursuing his interest. Clark's family moved when he was 11, and a boy at school shared his passion for music.

"He said, 'We should be in a band.' But we never were," Clark

recalled.

He explained that the boy thought he was a good guitarist, which he described as funny.

"All I knew were three chords," Clark admitted.

He received an electric guitar for Christmas that year, and he began writing his own songs.

"I loved it," he said. "I played guitar all the time. I would play my guitar from the time I got home until dinner and then after dinner until bedtime."

Clark also took piano lessons and played saxophone in his school band. In high school, he played guitar in a hard-rock band and then he was a member of a deathmetal band.

"We played one show – thank God," he said with a grin.

As an adult, Clark played "in a more melodic metal band," he said, for eight years.

Clark began teaching guitar when he was in high school. His first student was one of his friends.

"His mom paid me 10 bucks a week," Clark remarked

Clark later became a guitar tech for a band called Ralphie; it was named after the character in "A Christmas Story." Now he works full time for Apple and enjoys music as a singer, songwriter and



guitarist. Nirvana was Clark's favorite band as he grew up, but his eclectic taste ranges from Pantera to Tiny Tim to Eric Clapton and Cream.
