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

## Remote lessons, new opportunities

Greetings!

We hope all of you are well! When we printed our last newsletter just over a month ago, we had no idea how much difference one month could make! Music is so important to all of us in these troubled times, and we're thrilled to offer remote lessons for our students.

well! They provided the following recommendations to help students succeed in an online format:

- Find a quiet place to take lessons so you can focus and clearly hear your instructor. A bedroom or home office works well for this – sometimes common areas such as living rooms or dining

rooms contain background noise and other distractions.

- Prepare a few minutes before lesson time. Have your device or computer ready, make sure your instrument is out of its case and tuned, and ensure that your books and music are at hand.
- Keep a pencil and notebook nearby to make notes on your music and to write down your assignment each week.

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- Ask as many questions as you need to. There's no such thing as a dumb question!
- And FOR PARENTS: If you'd like to confer with the teacher about your child's progress or assignments for the week, please check in a few minutes before the lesson is over!

Music lessons provide important continuity for students who have seen most other activities called off for now.

Making music is also an outlet to express our feelings and relieve stress, depression and anxiety as we adjust to difficult changes in our everyday lives. And research shows that students who make music perform better academically.

Beat the cabin-fever blues with your music lessons! Students will continue to earn Musical Ladder awards – trophies, wristbands and certificates – during this time at home. And we have some

exciting news! The Musical Ladder System has debuted two new wristbands that teachers may award while we're sheltering in place.

One is simply called the Hope wristband, which may be earned in the next 30 days. The other is titled Practice Champ. Teachers may award this wristband to students who practice four to five times a week, every week, for 30 days. We will look to parents of young students to confirm this amount of practice time!


