play together, including a song from “Pirates of the Caribbean.”

“He loved that,” Patrick said. “If I could play with him every single song, he would never stop playing.”

Patrick wanted to learn guitar when he was in high school but didn’t think he had time. He bought a guitar when he was in his 30s, but it was left in storage when he moved to Belgium.

“I always kind of kicked myself for not learning,” Patrick said.

When he worked in Belgium, he joined colleagues who liked to jam together, but Patrick said the group was more advanced than he was. After his family moved back to the United States and Rylan started learning piano, Patrick decided to pursue his dream.

“Since I’m here anyway, why not sign up for my own lessons?” Patrick said. “From there I’ve really enjoyed it.”

Patrick practices for 30 minutes a day at home, and he studies with instructor Les Clark to further develop his talent. Clark advises him if a particular string isn’t ringing out or if he’s holding his hand incorrectly.

“I come here and it reinforces my good behavior, and Les lets me know if I’m behaving poorly,” Patrick said. “Not only does he teach me how to play the song but how to embellish it – add my own flair to it.”

Patrick admitted that Rylan sometimes prefers to skip piano practice, but Patrick insists

that his son persevere. Rylan can improvise and has begun to make up his own music. He was especially excited to learn music from a “Pirates of the Caribbean” book. Patrick said his son even draws pirate ships in his spare time.

“If he could watch that movie all the time, he would,” Patrick added.

Rylan has enjoyed learning a new skill.

“I can play any song,” he said, although he admitted it sometimes takes practice.

Rylan overcame his nervousness and played in the Student Showcase in December at the Wichita Music Academy, where his father also performed. They plan to play again in the May showcase.

Patrick said the most important advice he could offer potential musicians was to practice on their own instead of playing solely during lesson time.

“Definitely keep it up,” he said. “You may not feel like you’ve made much progress, but for most of us, it doesn’t happen overnight. It takes time.”

Patrick thought he was too busy for music lessons in high school, but now that he has the packed schedule – and the perspective – of an adult, he makes music a priority.

“It’s never too busy,” he said. “It’s healthy for your brain, too. There’s an article recently talking about learning an instrument and how it can prevent Alzheimer’s.” ❤️

since he didn't know what they'd be doing.

"I didn't know if we were going to a cooking class or a dance class or what," he said.

The Hentzens are in the first weeks of their second round – Book 2 – of the Goofin' Around classes and they couldn't be happier. Stephanie's father played trumpet his entire life, so she was raised with music. She likes the books used in the class because they have music she recognizes. For Bernie, who had some piano lessons as a child, the best thing is "you can play at a pace that helps it come more naturally."

The couple agreed that the Lowrey EZ Play is the "key"(board) to success.

"When I took lessons as a kid, I had no rhythm," Bernie said, adding that the teacher "threatened" to lend him a metronome.

"The Lowreys are great for keeping time," Stephanie said. Additionally, the EZ play method allows the user to play a whole chord with one finger. "You can go a long way real fast," she said.

The Hentzens have three children and eight grandchildren. There is a true family affair – two of their children work with Bernie at the family contracting business. Stephanie helps out with the grandchildren, as well as some of the paperwork for the business.

"Our children were surprised that we were taking keyboard classes and thought it would be something we did for a month and then quit," Stephanie said.

But now in their Book 2 class, they plan to keep going.

"The Goofin' Around class is our date night. After we leave class, we go out to eat then go home and race to the keyboards. I usually win," Stephanie said with a chuckle.

The Hentzens described the staff at Garten's Music as friendly and accommodating.

"When I came in to sign up for classes, Vesta (Campbell, Garten's staff member) showed me what she was learning in the class," Stephanie said. "It was very helpful. All the staff is very encouraging." ❤️
